

CARROLL COUNTY PARKS

DEER CREEK PARK/FRENCH POST PARK

- The parks are open the 2nd weekend of April to the 3rd weekend of October (depending on weather)
- Deer Creek Park's Basketball Courts, Playgrounds, Shelters and Fishing Pond are open year-round.
- The pond is accessible by parking above and walking down during the off season, no ice fishing allowed.
- No boats, canoes, kayaks, or swimming in the pond due to unknown safety hazards below the surface.
- No guns, alcohol or illegal substances allowed.

CAMPING/RV FEES

There is a one-week limit to camping with a two-week break between weeks.

Primitive Tent Camping (no power or water) at French Post and Deer Creek (in non-RV sites)

- \$10 per night

Tent Camping on an RV Site (with power and water) at Deer Creek

- \$20 per night Sunday - Thursday
- \$25 per night Friday and Saturday nights.

Please note:

- There is no weekly rate for tents, it is on a per night rental basis.
- Campsite Occupancy Primitive or Regular camping is 2 tents and 6 people per site.

RV Camping at Deer Creek

- \$30 per night.
- \$150 weekly rate (with a 7-day limit)

Please note: Campsite Occupancy for RV Camping is 1 camper, 1 tent, 6 people per site

Clubhouse Rental at Deer Creek

- \$55/day with a \$100 damage deposit that is refunded after use and inspection

Weekend Deer Creek Park Campground Rental (all sites and clubhouse)

- \$500 weekend

Please note: Public access to the fishing pond must be allowed

PARK RULES

1. Quiet hours are 11:00 pm – 7:00 am.
2. Contacting the Park Steward before setting up is required. Just because a spot is empty when you are there does not mean it has not been reserved for someone coming later.
3. Payment is by cash or check (made to Carroll County Parks). The person registering must be at least 18 years of age. Refunds will be on a case-by-case basis.
4. Maximum stay is 7 consecutive nights. Camper may return after a two (2) week break if spaces are available.
5. One vehicle is allowed per campsite overnight.
6. Guests of campers must follow Park Rules and must leave during the Quiet hours.
7. Campers are expected to keep (and leave) their campsite clean, neat, and free of trash.
8. One picnic table per campsite is provided when available.
9. Park visitors must stay within the park boundaries. The surrounding land is private property, and you will be trespassing.
10. Shelter houses are not to be used as campsites.
11. Smoking is prohibited inside the clubhouse and the bathrooms.
12. Bathrooms are to be kept clean and free of all personal items. If you have issues with the plumbing, please contact the park steward immediately so it can be checked.
13. Bathroom showers are for registered campers only.
14. The Storm Shelter at Deer Creek Park is for storm protection only, not as a place to stay.
15. Everyone is responsible for their own pet as described in the pet rules below.

PET RULES

1. Six-foot leash rules apply to the entire park. Dogs must be on a leash unless they are inside your camper, tent or vehicle.
2. Respect our wildlife and plant life. Your dog, as well as you, are visitors to their area.
3. Pick up after your dog. Bring plastic bags to hold dog droppings and dispose of them properly.
4. Quiet hours apply to all guests, including your pet.
5. Keep your pet with you. If you need to leave, please take your pet with you. They do miss you and tend to bark more when you are gone.
6. Make sure your pet's vaccinations are up to date. This is state law. Proof of vaccinations may be requested at any time.
